

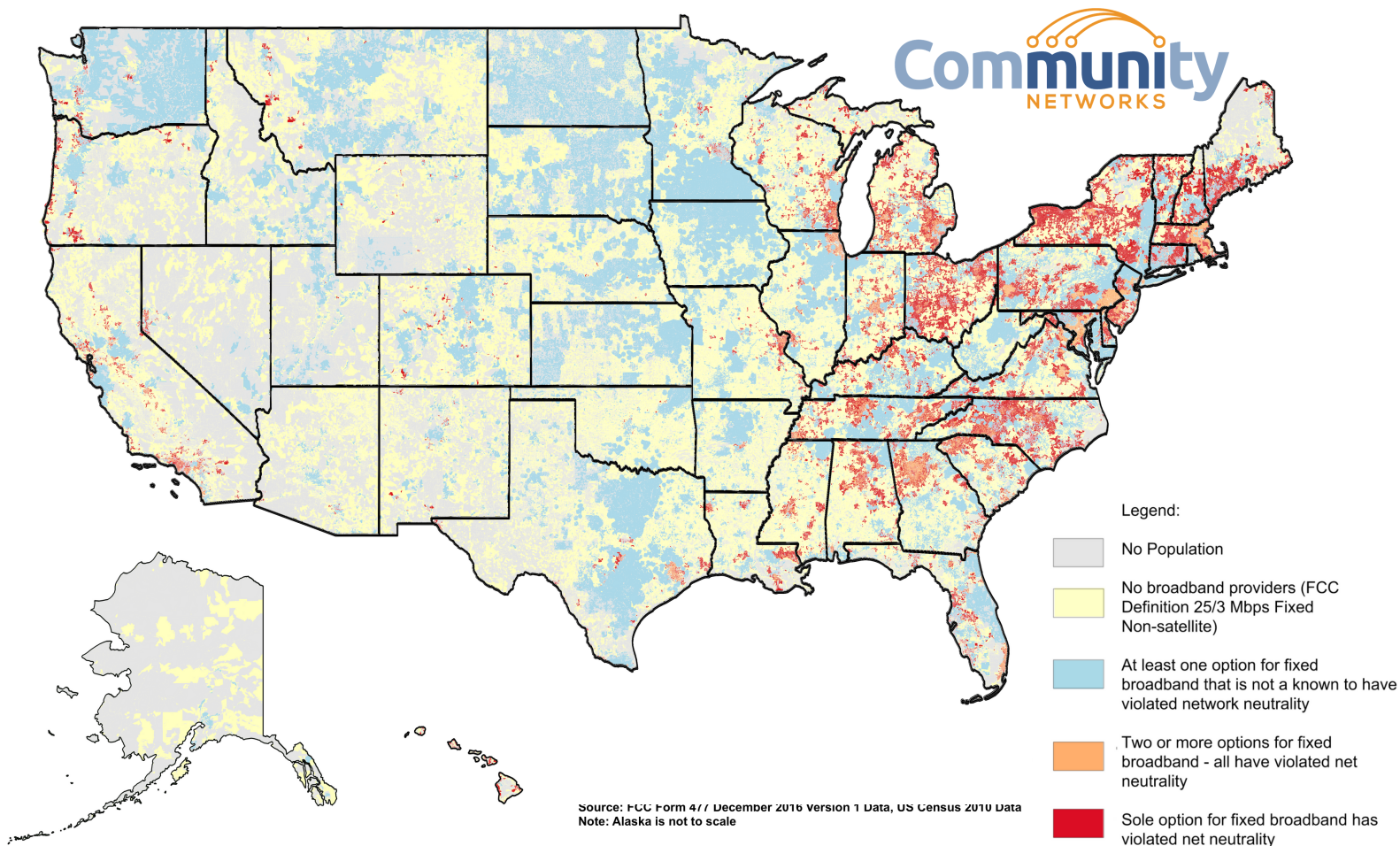
NET NEUTRALITY REPEAL BY THE NUMBERS

29 million - have no broadband access.

71 million - have one option for broadband access from a known net neutrality violator*

58 million - have two options for broadband access from known net neutrality violators*

129 million Americans are limited to broadband Internet access from known net neutrality violators and will have no protection after repeal. ***The FCC should focus on local Internet choice, not protecting monopoly power.***

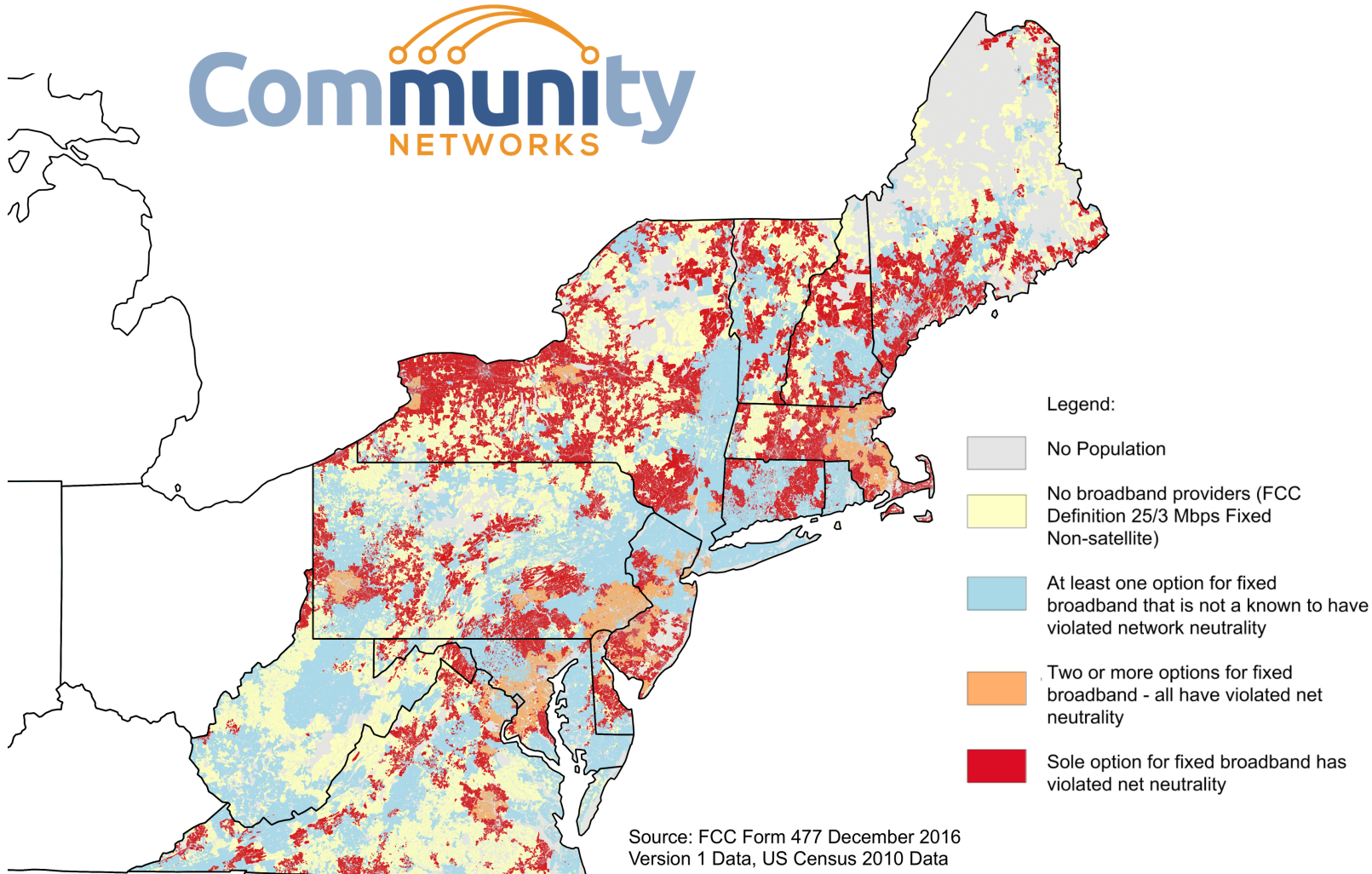
NET NEUTRALITY REPEAL BY THE NUMBERS

18.7 million - have two options for broadband access from known net neutrality violators*

37.7 million Americans from Virginia to Maine are limited to broadband Internet access from known net neutrality violators and will have no protection after repeal. ***The FCC should focus on local Internet choice, not protecting monopoly power.***

NET NEUTRALITY REPEAL BY THE NUMBERS

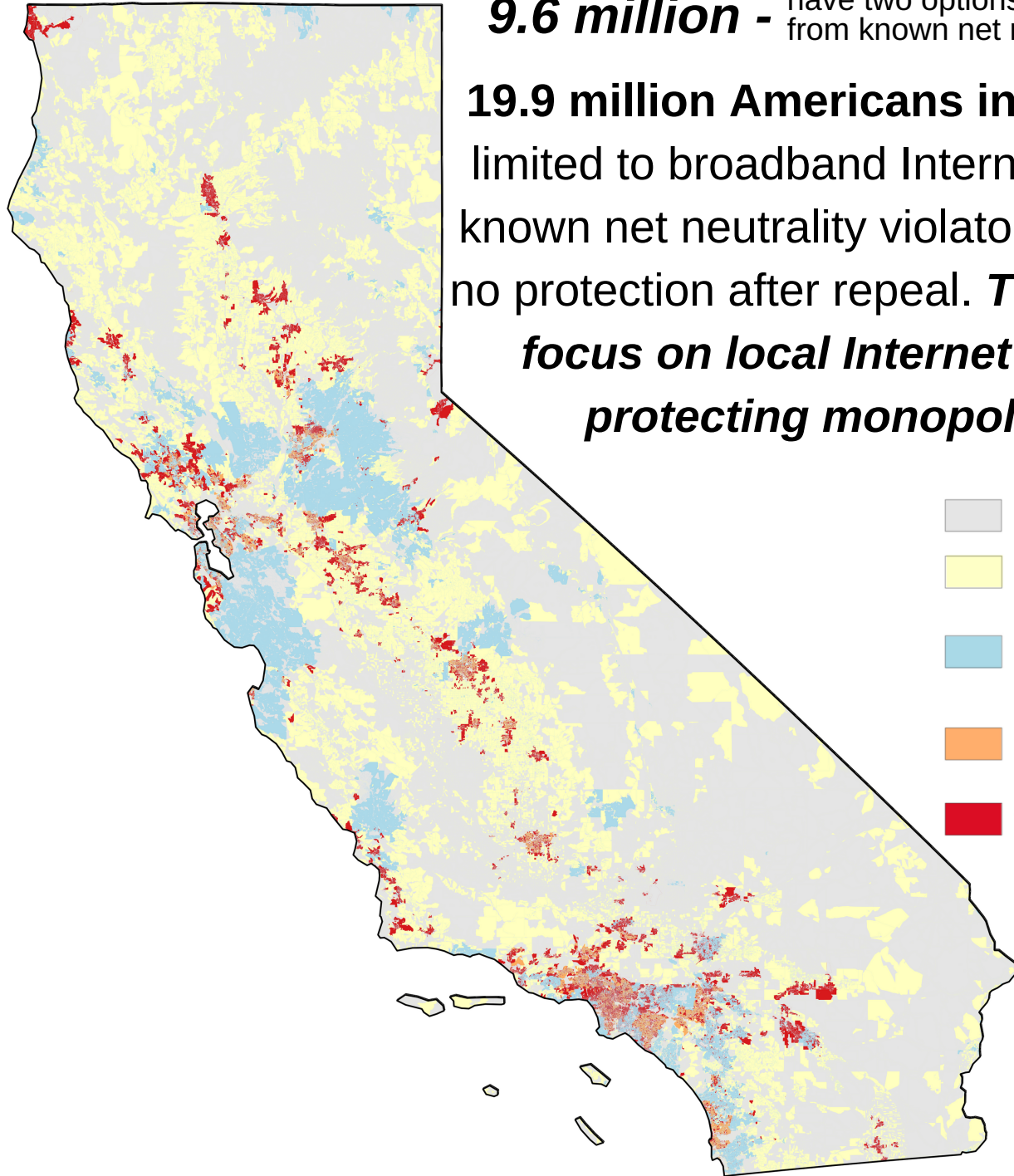


2 million - have no broadband access.

10.3 million - have one option for broadband access from a known net neutrality violator*

9.6 million - have two options for broadband access from known net neutrality violators*

19.9 million Americans in California are limited to broadband Internet access from known net neutrality violators and will have no protection after repeal. ***The FCC should focus on local Internet choice, not protecting monopoly power.***
